## **MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS 2022-23**

#### **GLOBAL ECONOMIC REVIEW**

Global economic activity is experiencing a broad-based and sharper than expected slowdown, with inflation higher than seen in several decades. The cost-of-living crisis, tightening financial conditions in most regions, Russia's invasion of Ukraine, and the lingering COVID-19 pandemic all weigh heavily on the outlook. Global growth is forecast to slow from 6.0 percent in 2021 to 3.2 percent in 2022 and 2.7 percent in 2023. This is the weakest growth profile since 2001 except for the global financial crisis and the acute phase of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The economic outlook depends on a successful calibration of monetary and fiscal policies, the course of the war in Ukraine, and growth prospects in China. Risks remain unusually large: monetary policy could miscalculate the right stance to reduce inflation; diverging policy paths in the largest economies could exacerbate the US dollar's appreciation; tightening global financing could trigger emerging market debt distress; and a worsening of China's property sector crisis could undermine growth. Multilateral cooperation remains necessary to fast-track the green energy transition and prevent fragmentation.

The Global inflation is forecast to rise from 4.7 percent in 2021 to 8.8 percent in 2022 but to decline to 6.5 percent in 2023 and to 4.1 percent by 2024. Monetary policy should stay the course to restore price stability, and fiscal policy should aim to alleviate the cost-of-living pressures while maintaining a sufficiently tight stance aligned with monetary policy. Structural reforms can further support the fight against inflation by improving productivity and easing supply constraints, while multilateral cooperation is necessary for fast-tracking the green energy transition and preventing fragmentation.

#### INDIAN ECONOMIC REVIEW

The Strong economic growth in the first quarter of FY 2022-23 helped India overcome the UK to become the fifth-largest economy after it recovered from repeated waves of COVID-19 pandemic shock. India's nominal GDP or GDP at current prices for the fiscal year 2022-23 is projected to reach ?272.41 lakh crore, (approximately \$3.30 trillion), marking a significant growth rate of 16.1 percent compared to the ?234.71 lakh crore (approximately \$2.84 trillion) in 2021-22, indicating a strong start for India's recovery from the pandemic. Given the release of pent-up demand and the widespread vaccination coverage, the contact-intensive services sector will probably be the main driver of development in 2022-2023. Substantially increasing private consumption, supported by rising consumer sentiment, will support GDP growth in the coming months.

India's economic condition during the first half of the current financial year highlighted the unwavering support the government gave to its capital expenditure, which reached ?4.1 lakh crores (US\$ 49.53 billion) during April-October 2022 which is 61.5% higher than the corresponding period of last year. The resilient growth of the Indian economy in the first half of FY 2022-23 has been the fastest among major economies, thereby strengthening macroeconomic stability. India registered a broad-based expansion of 9.7% in the first half of FY 2022-23, supported by robust domestic demand and upbeat investment activity. As a result of the comeback in economic activity across all sectors, India's overall employment situation has improved

As we head into 2023, global economic developments are expected to complicate the outlook further, and therefore continued vigilance is a critical aspect in maintaining India's external resilience. Going forward, India needs to focus on medium-term challenges such as securing technology and resources for energy transition and skilling its youth for the 21st century economy, while staying the course on fiscal consolidation. With continuous efforts during the last several years, a strong platform has been erected on which the superstructure of a middle-income economy can be constructed

#### **INDUSTRY OUTLOOK**

The private sector and foreign companies were allowed to introduce new Mutual Funds to India. This led to a surge in the number of Mutual Fund Houses or Asset Management Companies, investors, and total assets under management (AUM). The AUM increased from Rs 470 billion in 1993 to ? 39,46,257 crore in 2023, a 25% CAGR (compound annual growth rate) in 30 years. This shows how quickly Mutual Funds gained popularity in the Indian markets

India's mutual fund market is underpenetrated. India's AUM to GDP ratio is only 16%, whereas the global average is around 75%. This shows there is a lot of scope for growth in this industry. As the masses slowly accept mutual funds, India's AUM to GDP ratio is also expected to improve over the years.

#### **BUSINESS PERFORMANCE**

#### Standalone & Consolidated

During the year the Company has generated revenue from operations of Rs. 499.74 lakhs (including other income) and earned net profit after tax Rs. 119.06 Lakhs as compared with the corresponding figures in the previous year of Rs. 1469.40 Lakhs and Rs. 96.58 Lakhs respectively. The total revenue is decreased by Rs.



969.66 Lakhs as compared with last year but net profit after tax is increased by Rs. 22.48 Lakhs as compared with last year.

#### DIVIDEND

Your Directors are constrained not to recommend any dividend for the year under report.

#### **TRANSFER TO RESERVES**

During the year under review, your Company has profit of Rs. 119.06 Lakhs and an amount of Rs. 119.06 Lakhs is proposed to be retained in the Profit and Loss Account.

#### SHARE CAPITAL

#### Authorized Share Capital

During the year, the company increased the Authorized share capital from Rs. 1,80,00,000/- (Rupees One Crore Eighty Lacs) to Rs. 2,10,00,000/- (Rupees Two Crore and Ten Lacs) vide passing ordinary resolution in Extra Ordinary General Meeting of the members of the company held on 28.04.2022. Hence, the authorized share capital of the Company as at March 31, 2023 was Rs. 2,10,00,000 (Rupees Two Crore and Ten Lacs only) consisting of 2,10,00,000 (Two Crore and Ten Lacs) equity shares of Rs. 1 (Rupees One) each.

#### • Issued and Paid-up Capital

The paid-up Equity Share Capital of the company is Rs. 2,07,30,000 (divided into 2,07,30,000 Equity Shares of Rs. 1/-each) as on March 31, 2023.

During the year under review The company has issued & allotted 5370000 equity shares of Rs. 1/- each at Rs. 19 /- per share under Initial Public Offer as approved in consultation with the authorized representative of the designated stock exchange viz. BSE Limited and approved in the board meeting dated 25.01.2023. These shares are ranking pari-passu with the old equity shares of the company. Proceeds of the said Issue were utilized for expansion of business. Therefore, there are no details to be disclosed as per Regulations 32(7A) of the SEBI Listing Regulations

#### PARTICULARS OF LOANS, GUARANTEES OR INVESTMENTS:

The Company has adopted new set of MOA and AOA upon conversion into public company from private company, has also made Alteration in the Capital Clause V of the Memorandum of Association of the company by way of increasing the Authorised Share Capital in accordance with the provisions of Companies Act, 2013 by passing Ordinary Resolution vide its Extra Ordinary General Meeting (EGM) held on 28.04.2022 respectively.

#### **BSE COMPLIANCES:**

The Company was listed on SME Platform of BSE Exchange as on 31st January, 2023. Thus all the requisite compliances were applicable to the Company after 31.03.2023. Further, the Company has complied with all the applicable compliances with respect to the quarter/year ended on 31.03.2023.

#### NOMINATION AND REMUNERATION POLICY

#### Purpose of this Policy:

DHARNI CAPITAL SERVICES LIMITED ("Company") has adopted this Policy on appointment and remuneration of the Directors, Key Managerial Personnel and Senior Management (the "Policy") as required by the provisions of Section 178 of the Companies Act, 2013 (the "Act") and the provisions of Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 as amended from time to time.

The purpose of this Policy is to establish and govern the procedure applicable:

- a) To evaluate the performance of the members of the Board.
- **b)** To ensure remuneration to Directors, KMP and Senior Management involves a balance between fixed and incentive pay reflecting short and long-term performance objectives appropriate to the working of the Company and its goals.
- c) To retain, motivate and promote talent and to ensure long term sustainability of talented managerial persons and create competitive advantage.

The Committee should ensure that the level and composition of remuneration is reasonable and sufficient to attract, retain and motivate Directors of the quality required to run the Company successfully and the relationship of remuneration to performance is clear and meets appropriate performance benchmarks.

#### **Definitions:**

**"Independent Directors"** means a director referred to in Section 149(6) of the Act and the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended from time to time

**"Nomination and Remuneration Committee"** ("the Committee"), by whatever name called, shall mean a Committee of Board of Directors of the Company, constituted in accordance with the provisions of Section 178 of the Act and the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended from time to time

**"Remuneration"** means any money or its equivalent given or passed to any person for services rendered by him and includes perquisites as defined under the Income-tax Act, 1961;

**"Key Managerial Personnel"** (the "KMP") shall mean "Key Managerial Personnel" as defined in Section 2(51) of the Act.

**"Senior Managerial Personnel/ Senior Management"** mean the personnel of the company who are members of its core management team excluding Board of Directors. Normally, this would comprise all members of management one level below the Executive Directors, including all functional heads.

#### Composition of the Committee:

The composition of the Committee is / shall be in compliance with the provisions of Section 178 of the Act and the provisions of Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 as amended from time to time.

# Role of the Committee:

The Committee shall:

- Formulate criteria for determining qualifications, positive attributes and independence of a Director.
- Formulate criteria for evaluation of Independent Directors and the Board.
- Identify persons who are qualified to become Directors and who may be appointed in Senior Management in accordance with the criteria laid down in this policy.
- To carry out evaluation of Director's performance.
- To recommend to the Board the appointment and removal of Directors and Senior Management.
- To recommend to the Board policy relating to remuneration for Directors, Key Managerial Personnel and Senior Management.
- To devise a policy on Board diversity, composition, size.
- Succession planning for replacing Key Executives and overseeing.
- To carry out any other function as is mandated by the Board from time to time and / or enforced by any statutory notification, amendment or modification, as may be applicable.
- To perform such other functions as may be necessary or appropriate for the performance of its duties.

# APPOINTMENT AND REMOVAL OF DIRECTOR, KEY MANAGERIAL PERSONNEL AND SENIOR MANAGEMENT

- a) The Committee shall identify and ascertain the integrity, qualification, expertise and experience of the person for appointment as Director, KMP or at Senior Management level and recommend his / her appointment, as per Company's Policy.
- **b)** A person should possess adequate qualification, expertise and experience for the position he / she is considered for appointment. The Committee has authority to decide whether qualification, expertise and experience possessed by a person is sufficient / satisfactory for the position.
- c) The Company shall not appoint or continue the employment of any person as Whole-time Director who has attained the age of seventy years. Provided that the term of the person holding this position may be extended beyond the age of seventy years with the approval of shareholders by passing a special resolution.

# TERM/TENURE

The Term of the Directors including Managing/Whole time Director/ Independent Director shall be governed as per the provisions of the Act and Rules made thereunder and the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended from time to time.

Whereas the term of the KMP (other than the Managing / Wholetime Director) and Senior Management shall be governed by the prevailing HR policies of the Company

# **EVALUATION**

The Committee shall carry out evaluation of performance of every Director.

The Committee shall identify evaluation criteria which will evaluate Directors based on knowledge to perform the role, time and level of participation, performance of duties, level of oversight, professional conduct and independence. The appointment / re-appointment / continuation of Directors on the Board



shall be subject to the outcome of the yearly evaluation process. The Framework for performance evaluation of Independent Directors and the Board is decided by Board and the Committee time to time.

# REMOVAL

The Committee may recommend with reasons recorded in writing, removal of a Director, KMP or Senior Management Personnel subject to the provisions and compliance of the Companies Act, 2013, rules and regulations and the policy of the Company.

# RETIREMENT

The Director, KMP and Senior Management Personnel shall retire as per the applicable provisions of the Act and the prevailing policy of the Company. The Board will have the discretion to retain the Director, KMP, Senior Management Personnel in the same position/ remuneration or otherwise even after attaining the retirement age, for the benefit of the Company.

# POLICY FOR REMUNERATION TO DIRECTORS/KMP/SENIOR MANAGEMENT PERSONNEL

1) Remuneration to Managing Director / Whole-time Director, KMP and Senior Management:

The remuneration / compensation / commission, etc., as the case may be, to the Managing / Whole time Director will be governed by the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and applicable Rules and Regulations and will be determined by the Committee and recommended to the Board for approval. The remuneration / compensation / commission, etc., as the case may be, shall be subject to the prior / post approval of the shareholders of the Company and Central Government, wherever required. Further, the Chairman & Managing Director of the Company is authorised to decide the remuneration of KMP (other than Managing / Whole time Director) and Senior Management, and which shall be decided by the Chairman & Managing Director based on the standard market practice and prevailing HR policies of the Company.

2) Remuneration to Non-Executive / Independent Directors:

The remuneration / commission / sitting fees, as the case may be, to the Non-Executive / Independent Director, shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Act and the Rules made thereunder for the time being in force or as may be decided by the Committee / Board

/ shareholders.

An Independent Director shall not be entitled to any stock option of the Company unless otherwise permitted in terms of the Act and the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended from time to time.

# Opinion

We have audited the accompanying consolidated financial statements of M/s. Dharni Capital Services Limited Formerly known as Dharni Online Services Private Limited and Dharni Capital Services Private Limited), Bangalore (hereinafter referred to as "the Holding Company"), its subsidiary (Holding Company and its subsidiaries together referred to as "the Group"), for the year ended 31st March 2023, the Statement of Profit and Loss (including Other Comprehensive Income), the Statement of Changes in Equity and the Statement of Cash Flows for the year then ended, and notes to the standalone Ind AS financial statements, including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the consolidated financial statements").
